Report





The conference was aimed to expose


the mother baby breath interface, Art of Bathing: The South Indian Tantric way, Usage of Mercury.

The college was conferred autonomous status for all Under-Graduate courses and two Post-Graduate courses in the Arts stream in the academic year 1981-82. The grant of autonomous status for science Post Graduate courses in the academic year 1995-96 made the college fully autonomous.

THE DEPARTMENT OF COOPERATION

The Post – Graduate and Research Department of Cooperation is one of the pioneering departments of the college. It has the distinction of inheriting the legacy of the College of Rural Higher Education (Ministry of Education, Government of India) which had existed before Arts and Science College, teaching Co-operation as a major subject since early 1960's for both UG, PG, M.Phil., and Ph.D programmes. The Department has so far produced 40 MPhil and 26 PhDs.

heme of the Seminar

Empowering women has become a key element in the development of any economy. It has been found that there are various forums and NGOs working hard in this direction. The Indian economy has been substantially liberalized in recent years with an increasing role for small scale and private enterprise.

Startup Village Entrepreneurship Programme (SVEP) is meant for encouraging rural youth including women to take up local entrepreneurship programs. The long term vision of the SVEP is to provide support for startup to 1 crore village enterprises and provide direct employment to 2 crore people. The SVEP shall help the rural poor to come out of poverty by helping them set up enterprises and provide support till the enterprises stabilize. The SVEP will provide the supported enterprises with business stuffs, exposure, loans for starting and business support.

Alongside economic liberalization has come a drive to enhance the role of women with the right moves to ensure that women have at least 30% of seats in local council and many other elected bodies. As a result women are playing a more vital role in the economic side, there is always a tradition of education for middle class women in India and increasingly there is strong and growing group of professional women holding positions in Indian Universities and Government service. Women have also traditionally been involved in the informed economy, working in family business without formal position or pay. Thus, their economic contribution is often undervalued or just not mentioned at all. The Indian Government and the State governments have taken some steps to encourage women to setup small business. Several schemes and business brought economic and social reforms but not in significant manner. This leads to search for alternative ways to serve the rural poor in general and rural women in particular. In such search the women Self-help group is praise worthy. The main objective of the seminar is to understand the factors responsible for encouraging women to become entrepreneurs to form self-help groups, to identify the opportunities/ challenges for the women entrepreneurs and ways and means for promotion of women entrepreneurs to form different self help groups in the Indian context.



The Department of Social Work organised a workshop on "Child Rights Sensitization for Social Workers" with the support of FORYOUCHILD on 13.03.2018.


The workshop aimed to sensitize social workers on the child rights issues and protection of children from various forms of abuses.

National Conference on Recent Trends in Chemistry -2018 (RTC'18)

REPORT

The department of chemistry organized a one-day national conference on "Recent Trends in Chemistry" on 02.02.2018. In total, 257 participants registered. The conference aimed to create awareness recent trends on organic and medicinal chemistry, catalysis and polymer chemistry, environmental and green chemistry, the chemistry of materials including computational chemistry and sensors.



Inaugural Session (9.45 - 10.30 am):

The programme started at 9.45 am with prayer. Rev. Swami Garishthananda Maharaj, Secretary, Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya, delivered the benedictory address and released the conference abstract.

Prof. Dr. P. S. Mohan, Head, Department of Chemistry, Bharathiar University, delivered the keynote address on the natural products in treating human diseases and emphasized the medicinal values of traditional plants.



Technical Session I: (11.00 am - 01.00 pm)

Dr. R. Nandhakumar, Department of Chemistry, Karunya Institute of Technology and Sciences, Coimbatore, presented a talk on "Rational design and synthesis of heterocycles based modular fluorescent chemosensors for cations/anions." He also elaborated on the development of sensors for detecting ions in modern applications and narrated the significance of fluorescent sensors in detecting ions in biomolecules.

Dr. H. Yuvaraj, Department of nanoscience and technology, Bharathiar University, Coimbatore, conferred the lecture on "Fabrication of 3D/2D functional materials for energy, sensor, and environmental remediation". Further, he explained the recent developments in electrochemical energy storage and the functioning of super capacitors and carbon nanotubes.

Dr. C. Ramalingam, Department of Chemistry, Kalasalingam Academy of Research and Education, Krishnankovil delivered the third invited talk. 

A society in which consumers pay using credit or debit cards, electronic funds transfer, or shop online instead of paying by cash or bank cheque is known as cashless economy. It also called "checkless society".

India continues to be driven by the use of cash; less than 5% of all payments happen electronically. However the Finance Minister, in 2016 budget speech, talked about the idea of making India a cashless society, with the aim of curbing the flow of black money.

The basic functions of money in any form in an economy are of transactions, precaution, speculative and standard of differed payments. Developing countries in general and India in particular, before and after independence, use metal and paper currency more to discharge the functions. It is a cash economy. In the wake of decision made by Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi to demonetize high value currency note of denominations 500 and 1000, the Indian Economy faced a setback. The population of India is highly habituated to cash transactions in both formal and informal financial sectors. The biggest problem with India is that 70% of the population including literate groups opt for monetary transaction and are reluctant to use cards for payment owing to various security reasons and operational inconvenience, Cashless payment can be defined as a transaction performed without using coins and notes but instead using credit/debit cards or other electronic modes of payment. When all the transactions of the country are cashless, it becomes a cashless economy.

India uses too much cash for transactions. The ratio of cash to gross domestic product is one of the highest in the world—12.42% in 2014, compared with 9.47% in China or 4% in Brazil.

In India, less than 5% of all payments happen electronically.

The number of currency notes in circulation is also far higher than in other large economies. India had 76.47 billion currency notes in circulation in 2012-13 compared with 34.5 billion in the US.

Some studies show that cash dominates even in malls, which are visited by people who are likely to have credit cards, so it is no surprise that cash dominates in other markets as well.

- 2. Only one team per college is allowed. One team may consist maximum of five members.
- 3. Maximum time allowed is three minutes.
- 4. First prize is Rs.1000. If two teams get the same point, then the prize will be shared between the two.

V SMART AUDITOR

- 1. One team may consist maximum of three members.
- 2. The team will be provided with the auditing situation.
- 3. They have to present solution to the auditing situation after taking five-minute discussion with the team for providing solution. One member of a team has to provide the right solution based on the discussion with the team members.
- 4. First prize Rs.1000. If two teams give the best solutions, then the prize will be shared between the two.


Intercollegiate Meet - COM-EXULTANT'2018
